September in the City of Plymouth means it's Fall Festival time! Thousands of people will come to town to enjoy ribs, pancakes, spaghetti, and barbecued chicken, and to ride the rides, listen to music, peruse the art, and take part in the myriad activities planned.

How did this signature Plymouth event begin? Here's an excerpt from Sam Hudson's *The Story of Plymouth, Mlchigan: A Midwest Microcosm.*

The first Fall Festival took place in Plymouth on Sunday, September 11, 1960, from 12:30 pm. to 6 pm. The City had agreed to close Penniman Avenue, between Main and Union. The concrete block barbecue pits were set up in the parking lot adjacent to the Penn Theatre. Picnic tables and chairs were set up in Kellogg Park which was colorfully decorated by members of the Rotary Club.


In my mind's eye, I can still see the late Horace Thatcher, then over 70, up on a ladder tacking streamers from tree to tree. The eighty members of the Rotary Club had sold tickets, at \$1.50 for adults and \$1.00 for children.

Now, the Rotarians had to roll up their sleeves, tie on their white aprons, and produce. They had to barbecue the chicken halves, boil the corn-on-the-cob, serve the meal, and keep the tables free from debris. At the end of the day they were happy but exhausted.

As the Plymouth Mail reported on September 14, "A bunch of sore backed, sunburned Rotarians folded up the tables, put out the fires and dragged themselves home – confident that they had successfully put on one of the biggest shindigs of its kind ever attempted in Plymouth."

The Saxtons public parking lot is taking shape. The underground storm sewer system and storm water detention have been completed. The concrete curbs were poured and crews are working to grade the stone base throughout the parking area. Once the concrete has cured, crews will return to install the drive approaches, sidewalks and asphalt pavement.



Progress continues on the Penniman wall. Most of the stone has been installed with some smaller pieces still left to finish. Next steps will include some sections of sidewalk replacement, backfill/topsoil between the sidewalk and the wall, installation of trees, shrubs, and mulch.

November 7, 2023 General Election

A recreation millage and City Commission candidates will be on the November 7 ballot in the City of Plymouth. Voters will be asked to select four City Commissioners from seven candidates: Incumbents Suzi Deal, Linda Filipczak, and Kelly O'Donnell and newcomers Catherine Coburn, Brock Minton, Ron Picard, and Josh Rimatzki.

The recreation millage is seeking approval to levy 1.75 mills for 12 years, from 2024 through 2035, to aquire, construct, improve, furnish, operate and maintain parks and recreation facilities. This would require an amendment to the City Charter.

Residents who would like to vote absentee should request an application if they have not already received one. Ballots will be mailed in late September to those who have sent in an application. October 23 is the last day to register by mail or online and be eligible to vote in the November election. After that, and through election day, residents may register in person at the Plymouth City Clerk's office.

August Police Training

Western Wayne County Special Operations Team Training

Team members attended the required regular monthly training sessions involving the many skills needed to successfully intervene during a critical incident situation such as a hostage rescue or barricaded gunman. These skills include: proper planning and response, firearms and equipment proficiency, team movement, surveillance, and much more.

Interagency Active Shooter Training/Exercise

Officers participated with police officers from Plymouth Township in drills and exercises that mimic and prepare them for potential mass casualty incidents such as a workplace or school shooting. The training was conducted over a period of two days at Tanger Education Center in Northville.

Crisis Negotiation Team Training

A sub-group of WWCSOT, team members attended regular training regarding skills related to the successful conclusion of hostage and barricaded subject situations.

Medical First Responder Continuing Education

Certified officers attended Continuing Education training regarding respiratory emergencies and the opioid epidemic. Various medical scenarios were also reviewed.

Water Meter Replacement Program - If you haven't already done so, please make your water meter replacement appointment through the HydroCorp website at www.WaterMeterInstall.com or by calling a HydroCorp customer service representative at (800) 315-4305 Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Catch Basins - As the leaves begin to fall, please remember to keep the catch basins clear to reduce flooding.

Crosswalks - Please be aware that you must wait for traffic to clear before entering a crosswalk. The proper procedure at the new flashing beacons is to press the button to activate the lights only after traffic clears. Drivers will then be reminded to approach cautiously. Cars are not required to stop when the lights are flashing unless there is a pedestrian already in the crosswalk.

School Bus Rules - When overhead lights are flashing yellow: Prepare to stop. When overhead lights are flashing red: Stop. When hazard warning lights are flashing: Proceed with caution. Those who pass stopped school buses may be charged with civil infractions carrying a fine between \$100 and \$500. Violators may also be required to perform up to 100 hours of community service at a school.


