Spring Citizens Academy

When we began offering Citizens Academy classes, we expected them to be popular, but we didn't know how popular and how impactful they would be to our community *and* to us. While residents gain understanding of the operations of every department in the City of Plymouth, the city gains informed residents who sometimes decide to get more involved. Of the 70 participants since 2022, three have run for City Commission, one was elected to the City Commission, three have been appointed to another board or commission, and one is now employed by the city. All have been asked to attend future citizen engagement events.

Participants learn about the responsibilities and services provided by each department through staff presentations, hands on activities, and behind-the-scene tours. Among the presenters are the city manager, the HR/IT director, the Department of Municipal Services director, the economic development director, the community development and planning director, the DDA director, the police chief, the city clerk, the finance director, and the recreation director.

City Commission Sets One-Year Tasks

The City of Plymouth operates under a strategic plan that is updated annually with one-year tasks. Staff and the City Commission collaborate on formulating the list, and the City Commission officially adopts it. Tasks fall under general goal areas, as illustrated below.

- Prepare & complete bond sale for road infrastructure projects
- Receive International City/County Management Association (ICMA) fire study and implement suggestions as warranted
- Pursue electrical upgrade in Old Village for special event purposes
- Complete parking deck engineering review
- Continue Michigan Green Communities Challenge (MGCC) – maintain bronze level and seek opportunities for advancement to silver
- Target citywide bike rack installation in high-traffic areas
- Review opportunities for additional parking spaces
- Install EV chargers at Plymouth Cultural Center (PCC)
- Monitor utilization of current EV chargers
- Plan/budget for mausoleum repair project at Riverside Cemetery
- Complete water meter upgrade program



Goal Area Two: Staff Development, Training, and Succession

- Continue staff development and succession planning
- Maintain staffing levels
- Update five-year staffing projections
- Continue diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) training opportunities
- Review opportunities for supplemental staffing – interns/volunteers

Goal Area Three: Community Connectivity

- Host Coffee with Commissioners
- Continue police community outreach programs - including Coffee with a Cop

City Wins State Award

The Department of Municipal Services was recognized by the Michigan Concrete Association for excellence on last year's Carol St. infrastructure improvement project. The award cites having to delay the project's start due to Consumers Energy's gas system improvements but nevertheless completing it on an accelerated schedule.

The project included 7,000 square yards of concrete pavement on the street, and another 12,000 square feet of driveway and ADA ramps, along with multiple tree plantings and greenspace upgrades.

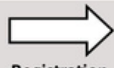

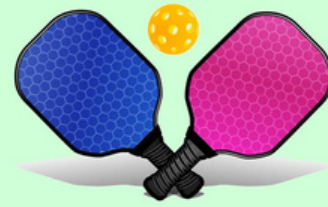

An agent must have written authority to represent the owner. Written petitions must be received by FRIDAY, March 15, 2024, by 12:00 p.m. Postmarks are not accepted.
